Exploring Change



Dear *{{First Name}}*,

Hola! By the time you read this, I'll be wandering around Spain. Our daughter has been in Granada this semester to study, and I want to improve my Spanish. But the main purpose of the trip is to explore this major change in my life as I step down as Executive Director of Lumunos. There is more to learn, both about how this role has changed me over 23 years, and what other changes are emerging in my life. After a month of eating tapas, butchering the Spanish language, and writing in my journal, I will return to step into my new role as the Program Director at Lumunos on Feb. 1.

I'm 63 now, and this transition feels like one of the biggest in my life. But wouldn't I have said the same thing about a number of other significant changes in my life? Getting married after 34 years of singleness was a big adjustment, as was becoming a parent. My first job after college felt like a HUGE change after 12 years of schooling. Recently adjusting to having both of my parents gone has been a more subtle, but still impactful change.

Your path has no doubt been different from mine. Still, if we had time to sit and talk I'll bet you could tell me about a series of major and minor changes that you have been through. Or maybe are still on.

At Lumunos, we believe that these changes are worth exploring. Whatever the external change is, there is usually a concurrent internal shift that happens too. Some changes start on the outside and move in; others begin internally and then change our external behavior. Often we are more vulnerable when we are in a time of change. The protective shell thins, or at

times is shattered completely. These changes are both illuminating and often need further illumination.

And that, dear reader, is our **theme for 2024:** *Illuminating Change*. We can't wait to explore this subject with you through a robust menu of events and content. For starters, I hope you will join Becca Perry Hill and Heather Bauer as we kick off our 2024 theme on January 30th.

The Changing Spiritual Landscape

As we move our focus towards change and transition in 2024, the Lumunos team will be inviting keynote speakers who will help us to *illuminate* the kinds of changes that all of us have experienced in one way or another.

Diana Butler Bass has spent her career studying and writing about religion and contemporary spirituality. In her 2015 book *Grounded* she writes, "Whenever a gulf opens between the way people experience God and how

institutions respond (or fail to respond) to such concerns, historical conditions ripen for spiritual revolution, reformation, and awakening." One clear indication of how that idea shows up has been the marked decline in church attendance over the last 50+ years, despite a still clear yearning for meaning and connection.

Diana Butler Bass has also documented her own changing relationship with religion. In the passage below, taken from the same book, she writes:

"Much to my surprise, church has become a spiritual, even a theological struggle for me. I have found it increasingly difficult to sing hymns that celebrate a hierarchical heavenly realm, to recite creeds that feel disconnected from life, to pray liturgies that emphasize salvation through blood, to listen to sermons that preach an exclusive way to God, to participate in sacraments that exclude others, and to find myself confined to a hard pew in a building with no windows to the world outside.

This has not happened because I am angry at the church or God. Rather, it has happened because I was moving around in the world and began to realize how beautifully God was everywhere: in nature and in my neighborhood, in considering the stars and by seeking my roots. It took me five decades to figure it out, but I finally understood. The church is not the only sacred space; the world is profoundly sacred as well."




2024 KickOff Event: Illuminating Change
